Physical space is among the most basic domains of experience and hence typically used in metaphorically structuring various abstract domains. We will first familiarize ourselves with notions of spatial cognition and their expression in language. These include, amongst others, frames of reference, trajector and landmark, spatial relations, dimensionality, spatial image schemas and spatial deixis. These notions will serve to analyze expressions of spatial relations in English, in particular by means of spatial prepositions. Prepositions and particles tend to be highly polysemous, and a major challenge of the course will be to discover the motivation underlying the extensions of their spatial meanings to temporal and abstract meanings.
