Course description:

What rights and values are important and how can we ensure that everyone gets them and respects them? We’re going to be reading a range of texts (poems, short stories, extracts from novels, essays, newspaper articles, etc), and looking not only at the ideas in them but also at the way that those ideas are expressed. Your aim will be to extend the range of structures and vocabulary that you have at your disposal when writing in a formal academic style.

There are separate grades for the A part and the B part, so although the two parts are linked, it is possible to do either part of this course independently of the other. If you want to do the B part on its own, you’ll have to do some of the reading from the A part to be able to follow what we’re doing.

You’ll have to bring your dictionary with you every week because we have no reference books available in this room. If you have a dictionary installed on your laptop or netbook, you’ll be able to use that but will need to make sure your battery is charged because there aren’t enough wall sockets to go round.
