Course description

**In this course students will analyze original data addressing research questions in bilingualism and write various chapters of an extended research paper. To this end rhetorical text books for native speakers will be consulted with advice and exercises on the “craft of research” concerning modern considerations in style (concision, voice and simplicity), planning and laying out information, use of diagrams, quotations, footnotes, etc. Students will be required to carefully research and write the introduction to an academic paper analysing original conversational data, to analyze several sequences from the transcription of a conversation, and to write the conclusion for such a paper.**
