#### **Course Description:**

The aim of this lecture course is to provide beginning students with a survey of American literature from its beginnings to the present. Organized in roughly chronological fashion, each lecture will discuss the most important authors and texts of a given period along with some lesser known ones. Literature as we understand it is a primary field of culture formation, and by studying it closely we will gain insights into America's cultural and historical development starting with the earliest (native American) stories about the creation of the world and continuing with the Puritan experiment of creating a perfect society in the New World. The American struggle for Independence eventually achieved in 1776 was followed by the consolidation of the nation during the Early Republic, which gave rise to new literary forms. Once we enter the 19<sup>th</sup> century we will become acquainted with Romanticism, Realism, and Naturalism as different ways of dealing with a vastly changing cultural and natural environment. In the latter part of the lecture course we will approach the 20<sup>th</sup> century and thus modernism and postmodernism before we finally turn to the present by getting to know today's literary scene in the United States as represented by some of its major literary voices.
