The term "modernism" describes a colorful set of cultural tendencies, movements and practices from the late 19th century on. Thus, the terminology in academia has shifted from the singular "modernism" to "modernisms" and we shall see that the multitude of artistic expressions usually grouped under one term is far more variegated than assumed.

In this course we will follow interdisciplinary approaches towards modernisms especially in close-readings of paintings, literary and theoretical texts as well as music. The transatlantic connection is thereby of great importance: the detonation of European avant-garde not just in contrast, but in intercommunion with the so-called "homemade modernism" in the USA. Hence, one particular focus will be the Armory Show of 1913 and its perception by the public.

The works to be discussed are from iconoclastic artists such as Pound, Eliot, Stein, Hartley, Marin, MacDonald-Wright a.o. as well as from poetic lyricists such as Sandburg, Anderson, Wilmer-Dewing, Weston Benson, Weir, Markham a.o. – all combined in a reader to be acquired at the beginning of the semester.

The course will have a slightly different set-up: Sessions are
