Course description:

Many publishers now offer supplementary materials online for reading groups, educators, librarians and parents. We're going to look at some of the materials available online, discuss them, assess them, work out models for writing them, and write our own. We're going to concentrate on fantasy, science fiction and horror. This is an intensive course, so you'll have to do most of the reading before the course begins. You'll be expected to write short essays, participate in group discussions, give short oral presentations, and write an individual reading, teaching or film guide, together with suggested answers. There will also be creative writing exercises.

You'll have to read at least one of the following and one young adult novel of your own choice (fantasy, science fiction, or horror) before the course:
