Course description:

This course introduces students to the standard methods and approaches for planning, conducting, interpreting and reporting research in Linguistics; and seeks to give students the working knowledge of how to conduct **empirical research in Linguistics**. The course is aimed at promoting the skills necessary to being effective consumers and producers of Linguistic research. This will involve learning to formulate research questions, to select suitable research designs, to use appropriate statistical analyses, and to interpret and report the results of studies. Students would be exposed to both theoretical and practical studies to evaluate, as well as the opportunity to initiate and discuss their own research ranging from term papers to dissertations.

Participants are expected to attend regularly, participate actively, do the assigned readings and be prepared to do a series of class and home exercises.
