In this seminar, we will discuss different forms of contemporary American writing. We will try to get a better understanding of the literary traditions as well as the innovative force that the texts under consideration display. All texts were published in 2015, the material to be discussed comprises a graphic short story ("A Brief History of the Art Form Known as 'Hortisculpture'") various short stories from different genres ("The Little Green God of Agony," "In Camera," and "Betsy from Pike"), reflects ethnically marked literary traditions, such as African American writing (*The Turner House*), the surprising return of a genuinely American genre, the novel of passing (*Mislaid*), new forms such as the spin-off of a popular podcast radio show (*Welcome to Night Vale*), and, finally, the king of the best-seller list's latest novel, Jonathan Franzen's *Purity*. Among the authors are thus famous winners of very prestigious prizes, such as Jonathan Franzen, William H. Gass, and Stephen King, as well as lesser-known young creative voices (Adrian Tomine, John McManus, Angela Flournoy, Joseph Fink, Jeffrey Cranor, and Nell Zink).

Please note:

→ The scope of required reading in this course is **very demanding**. Please take this into account when deciding to participate in this course. You have to be a passionate reader and lover of literature to profit fully by the seminar! And you have to be able to purchase the novels (although there will, of course, be copies in the library, and you will find the short stories in the AGORA room connected to the seminar).

 \rightarrow There will also be 8 quizzes meant as encouragement to keep up with the assigned reading of which you will have to pass at least 6.
