<p>Course description</p> <p>Conversational interaction is one of the cornerstones not only of human social life, but also whole societies depend on oral communication in order to function. After all, talking is the most common and prevalent way for people to engage with each other. In that, people are astoundingly strict at adhering to certain underlying rules that organise everyday conversation. The issues of who talk when and for how long or how to deal with misunderstanding needs to be negotiated between the interlocutors in the given situation. The aim of Conversation Analysis (CA) is to describe and analyse the stable practices that people deploy in order to structure their conversation. To work out patterns, single instances of talk-in-interaction as well as collections of cases are examined.</p> <p>This course will firstly introduce students to the constitutive features of everyday conversation as for example turn-construction, action formation or sequencing. Based on this knowledge, methods and analytic procedures used in CA will be applied to recordings of spoken language.
