Course description

This seminar explores changing views of kingship and popular rule in the early modern period. Over the course of the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries, absolutist models of kingship were variously challenged by advocates of parliamentary and democratic rule. The seminar will introduce you to a representative cross section of texts which propose radically new models of governance, even as they articulate anxieties about republicanism taken too far. Works to be discussed include short excerpts from Thomas More's *Utopia* (1516), proto-communist Digger tracts, the writings of James I of England, and John Milton's *Paradise Lost* (1667). Moreover we will discuss two plays by Williams Shakespeare – *Henry V* (c.1599), and *Coriolanus* (c.1608) – and Philipp Massinger's *The Renegado* (c.1630)
