Course description:

As students of English language it is interesting to investigate the acquisition of English as an additional language. For some students, English is the first language acquired after German. It is the first foreign language and probably the first experience of language contact. Due to globalization and migration the number of bilingual children within the society has increased. These bilingual children acquire English as their third and not their second language. This course will deal with the differentiation of second and third language acquisition as well as language contact. The main goal will be to detect instances of cross-linguistic influence (CLI) and to try to understand transfer between the languages that come into contact.

After working through the theories in relation to second and third language acquisition, we will discuss models on language transfer. With this knowledge you will have the chance to analyze several English texts written by students from different schools in Germany over a period of 3 years. The data derives from a huge research project of the University of Hamburg (Multilingual Development: A Longitudinal Perspective) and includes many background variables of each student that can serve as a useful basis for profound analyses.
