## **Course description**

Turning to literary works produced in England during the seventeenth and early eighteenth centuries, this seminar illustrates the immense influence which cultural contact and exchange exerted on literary production under the socio-economic conditions of early modernity. In addition to inventing culturally resonant stereotypes of the alien 'other', early modern texts also characteristically call into question the univocality of (Western) discourses about such otherness. The seminar explores and contextualizes an exemplary range of literary works which capture the non-fixity of cultural identities in this period. Works we will discuss in depth include two plays by William Shakespeare – *Othello* (c.1603) and *The Tempest* (c.1610-11) – as well as Daniel Defoe's *Robinson Crusoe* (1719).

# Students will need to read Shakespeare's *The Tempest* by 6 November.
