Course description:

In the 1820s American historical awareness increased significantly in a still relatively young country. In 1820 America celebrated the bicentennial of the landing of the Mayflower, in 1826 John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, two of the founding fathers and early presidents of the republic, died on the same day and in 1830 the settlement of Massachusetts Bay was commemorated. With the growing historical awareness American writers also began to fictionalize their history. The four best known historical novels of the antebellum period we will discuss in class. One of the questions will be how past and present are intertwined in the books.
