Course description:

The course is based on the textbook *Cognitive English Grammar (CEG)* by Günter Radden & René Dirven and the script of a workbook accompanying the book. We will first look at the theoretical framework of cognitive grammar and then consider grammatical areas of English that tend to present particular difficulties to learners of English: noun classes, determiners, quantifiers, modifiers, aspect, tense, and modality. The basic tenet underlying the cognitive approach is that language is the product of our cognition and as such meaningful and motivated. The challenge of the course will be to abandon traditional thinking of grammar as a system of rules and take a fresh view of its motivated nature. The insights gained from this approach can also be immediately relevant for a didactic grammar of English.

Participants are expected to do a considerable amount of reading and exercises for each session. If your time schedule does not allow you to attend each session throughout the whole term, better decide not to enrol for the course.
