Course Description:

The aim of this lecture course is to provide students with a survey of American cultural history from the Colonial Period roughly to the early 20th century. We will start by considering early conceptualizations of America mostly by Europeans, then turn to images of Native Americans, before we will explore the Puritan perspective on the 'New World'. Next, religious formations such as Millennialism and the Great Awakening will be considered, before we make it to the Revolutionary Period and the Early Republic and, in their wake, the related ideologies of Expansionism and Manifest Destiny. American Transcendentalism as the foremost intellectual liberation movement of the mid-19th century will be highlighted, as well as women's position in American society. Slavery, the American Civil War and the period of Reconstruction following it will be our focus toward the end of the course, before we consider the situation of the so-called 'Gilded Age' with its concomitant social problems prompted by mass immigration, urbanization, and industrialization.
