## **Course Description:**

In this course, our aim is to study recent graphic life writing as an emerging sub-genre of graphic narrative or, more simply put, comics. Roughly since the publication of Art Spiegelman's *Maus* in the 1980s have hand-drawn autobiographical comics become an important format for subjective expression focusing, more often than not, on a young person's struggle with identity formation in adverse surroundings such as a dysfunctional family. Among others, we will read and discuss Craig Thompson's *Blankets* (2003), Alison Bechdel's *Fun Home. A Family Tragicomic* (2006), and David Small's *Stitches. A Memoir* (2009).

Throughout, we will pay much attention to the formal elements of hand-drawn graphic narrative. Toward this end we will familiarize ourselves with Karin Kukkonen's terminology for the study of graphic narrative as presented in her recent *Studying Comics and Graphic Novels* (2013). Moreover, we will make frequent references to Elisabeth El Refaie's highly recommended *Autobiographical Comics: Life Writing in Pictures* (2012), one of the first book-length studies of the genre.

## **Course Requirements:**

Beyond a keen interest in the study of graphic narrative: Regular attendance, active participation, response papers or an oral presentation, and a term paper of ca. 15 pages at the end of the course.
