Despite the continuous democratic setbacks in Brazilian society, that led to the conservative turn in the 2018 elections, Brazil remains a laboratory of innovative political experiences that carry within themselves the prospect of resistance on many fronts. In this context, female and feminist participation are a central pillar in the construction of a structural movement of democratic resistance.
